You can use kind actions and words during dismissal by:

- Talking to your friend (use a quiet voice Voice Volume 2).
- Helping your friend by telling them their backpack is unzipped or reminding them to tie their shoe.
- Holding the door for the person exiting behind you.
- Pick something up if someone else drops it.
- Respect others' personal space. Leave enough room between you and the person in front of you.

What do you think it looks like to act safely during dismissal?



You can stay safe during dismissal by...

- Using safe hands.
- Using safe feet.
- Report unsafe behavior to an adult.

What does it look like to act responsibly during dismissal?



You can be responsible during dismissal by...

- Using a Voice Volume 2.
- Listening to all adults.
- Stay with your class in a single file line.
- Follow the rules and expectations for dismissal.
